



Dr. Altha J. Stewart is Associate Professor and Chief of Social and Community Psychiatry at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center in Memphis and Director, Center for Health in Justice Involved Youth. She was previously Executive Director, Just Care Family Network, Memphis' federally funded System of Care program and Director, System of Care for Shelby County. Her career spans over three decades of work as the CEO of large public MH systems in Michigan, Pennsylvania and New York. Dr. Stewart is vice-chair of the Memphis/Shelby County Juvenile Justice Board, the advisory body recommending program improvements and policy changes to address the needs of youth in or at-risk of entering the juvenile justice system. She was team leader on the SAMHSA/MacArthur Foundation grant, *Improving Diversion Policies and Programs for Justice Involved Youth with Behavioral Health Disorders*, and the *Reducing Racial and Ethnic Disparities Program* sponsored by Center for Juvenile Justice Reform and Center for Children's Law and Policy.

Dr. Stewart is currently Secretary of the American Psychiatric Association Board of Trustees, and was recently elected President-Elect of the Association. She is also a past President of the American Psychiatric Foundation, the Association of Women Psychiatrists, and the Black Psychiatrists of America. A native of Memphis, TN she completed Temple University Medical School and residency at Hahnemann University Hospital, both in Philadelphia. She is a recipient of the AWP/APA Alexandra Symonds Award and an honorary *Doctor of Laws* degree from Regis College.
